Requirements for AAACEAINC Scholarship Eligibility

Eligibility

- Minimum 90 average in the five academic subject areas that include the following--
- 4 years of college preparatory courses in these academic subjects: Mathematics—for example: Algebra, Intermediate Algebra, Geometry, Trigonometry, Calculus; English Language Arts; Science courses (with Lab requisites) for example: General Science, Earth Science, Biology, Chemistry, Physics; Social Studies; and Foreign Language (this is a four year sequence; not two years of one language and two years of another, or any combination of a language, etc.). Honors and Advanced Placement courses are welcome but optional.
- Suggested minimum SAT score 1790 --copy of official report with full composite of verbal, math, and writing scores (The Scholarship Committee may evaluate a lesser score based on academic record, exemplary community service, letters of recommendation, courses in progress, resume, and other appropriate factors relevant to eligibility).
- Minimum Community Service Hours 200 (Average of 50 service hours per year, grades 9-12).
- Applicants must show that they have also given community service hours in the field of the designated scholarship during the course of their high school tenure.
- High School graduates with proof of college acceptance letter to the targeted school to be attended that following August/September (failure to graduate will forfeit scholarship).
- U.S. Citizen of African American or Caribbean Heritage
- 3 letters of recommendation – ***There is to be one (1) from chosen field of study.*** In the specified fields--Nursing/Health Science/Medicine from Hospital Administrator, Doctor, Registered Nurse, Health Teacher, Director of Health Facility or Health Science Program; Library/Language Arts from Library Director, English Language Arts Principal/Assistant Principal or English Language Arts Teacher; Aviation/Math and Science from Aviation Program Director, Aviation School, Aviation Teacher, Math or Science Principal/Assistant Principal/ Teacher. ***There are to be two (2) from community service organizations*** submitted by program director or supervisor attesting to leadership and level of commitment.
These recommendations are to attest to candidate's moral fiber and character.
(No relatives may submit a letter of recommendation.)
All letters of recommendation must be provided on organization letterhead with title of writer.
- Proof of Birth/Naturalization with copies of official certificate and copy of official Social Security Card
- Applicants must sign a promissory note to “Pass It On” and help others along life’s road.
- Personal Interview with Scholarship Committee
- Scholarships are not limited to New York State residents; however, all candidates must be available to sit for personal interview and, if awarded, available to receive scholarship at Awards Ceremony with no additional cost to AAACEAINC. Students may use scholarship at any Accredited College or University.
